# National context

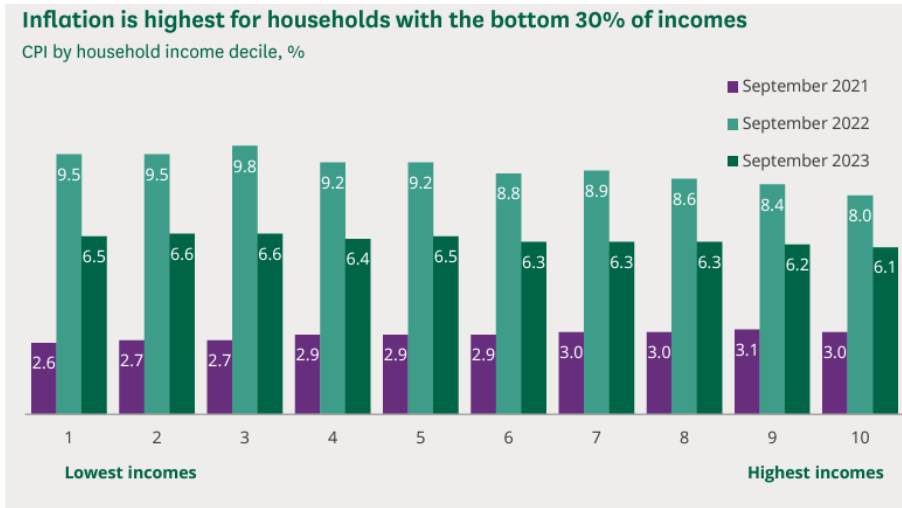

## The impact of inflation is highest for low-income households

Low-income households spend more relative to their income on food and energy and save less, and so are affected more by rising inflation. The graph shows how inflation rates differ for households at different income deciles, with the highest levels recorded for low-income households in September 2022, but rates still high in September 2023 at around 6.6%.

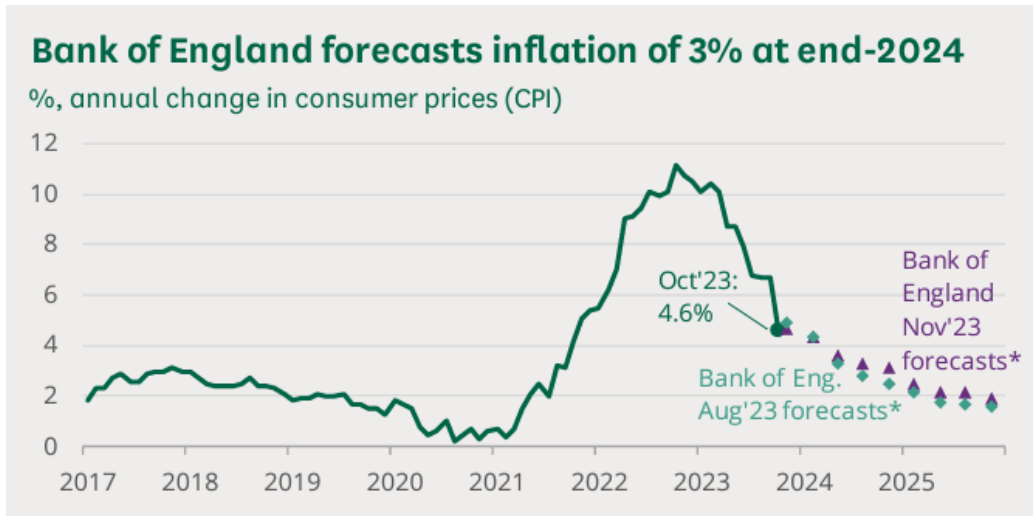

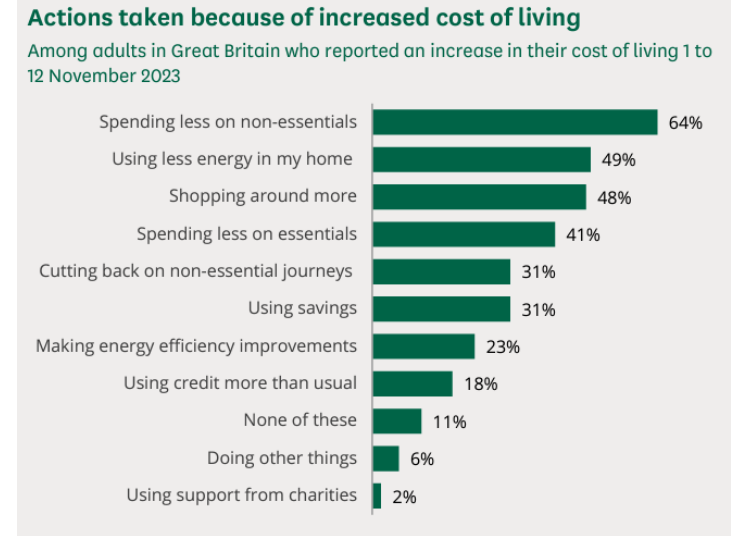
**Debt is increasing for some households.** The JRF estimates that 20% of households in the bottom 40% of incomes **reported borrowing money or using a credit card to pay for rent, energy or council tax** in the last two years. The FCA has reported that 29% of UK households saw their **unsecured debt increase** in the six months to January 2023. 21% of adults described keeping up with bills and credit commitments as a heavy burden in January 2023, compared to 15% in May 2022.

Rising costs have changed behaviour: 64% of people say they are spending less on non-essentials, 49% are spending less on energy, and 41% are spending less on essentials.

Inflation has gone up globally over the past year, but **the UK's inflation rate is higher** than comparable economies. Over the next two years, inflation is expected to go down, but slower than previously thought.

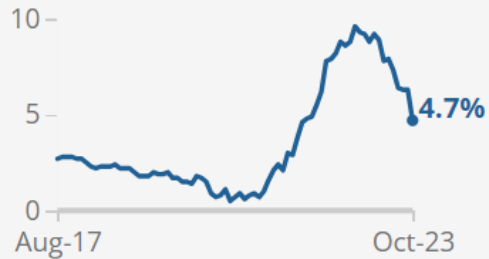

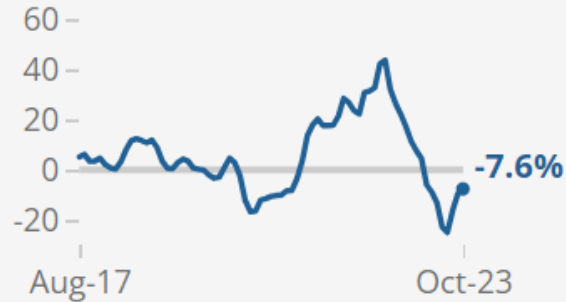
### Inflation falls to 4.7% in October 2023

Consumer Prices Index including owner occupiers' housing costs (CPIH) annual inflation rates, UK



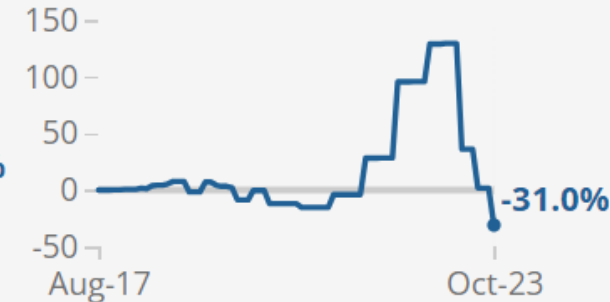
### Motor fuel prices fell by 7.6% in the year to October 2023

Motor fuel annual CPIH inflation rates, UK



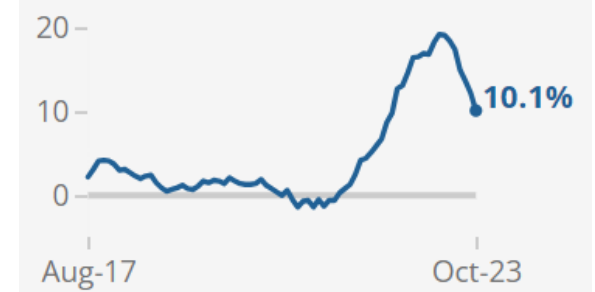
### Gas price inflation fell by 31.0% in the year to October 2023

### Inflation rate for food and non-alcoholic beverages continued to ease to 10.1% in October 2023

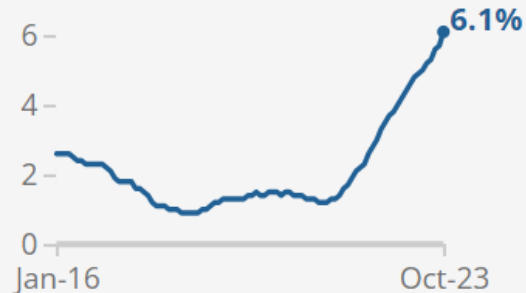
Food and non-alcoholic beverages annual CPIH inflation rates, UK

### The UK annual private rental price growth rose to 6.1% in the 12 months to October 2023

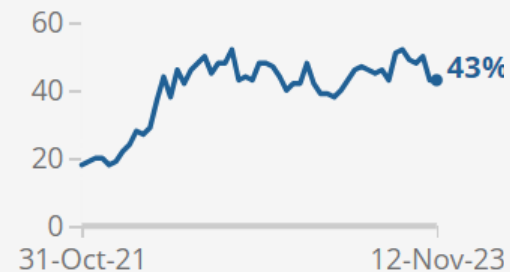
Index of Private Housing Rental Prices percentage change over 12 months, UK

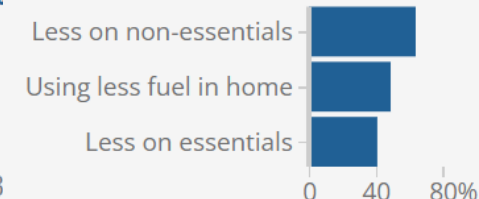

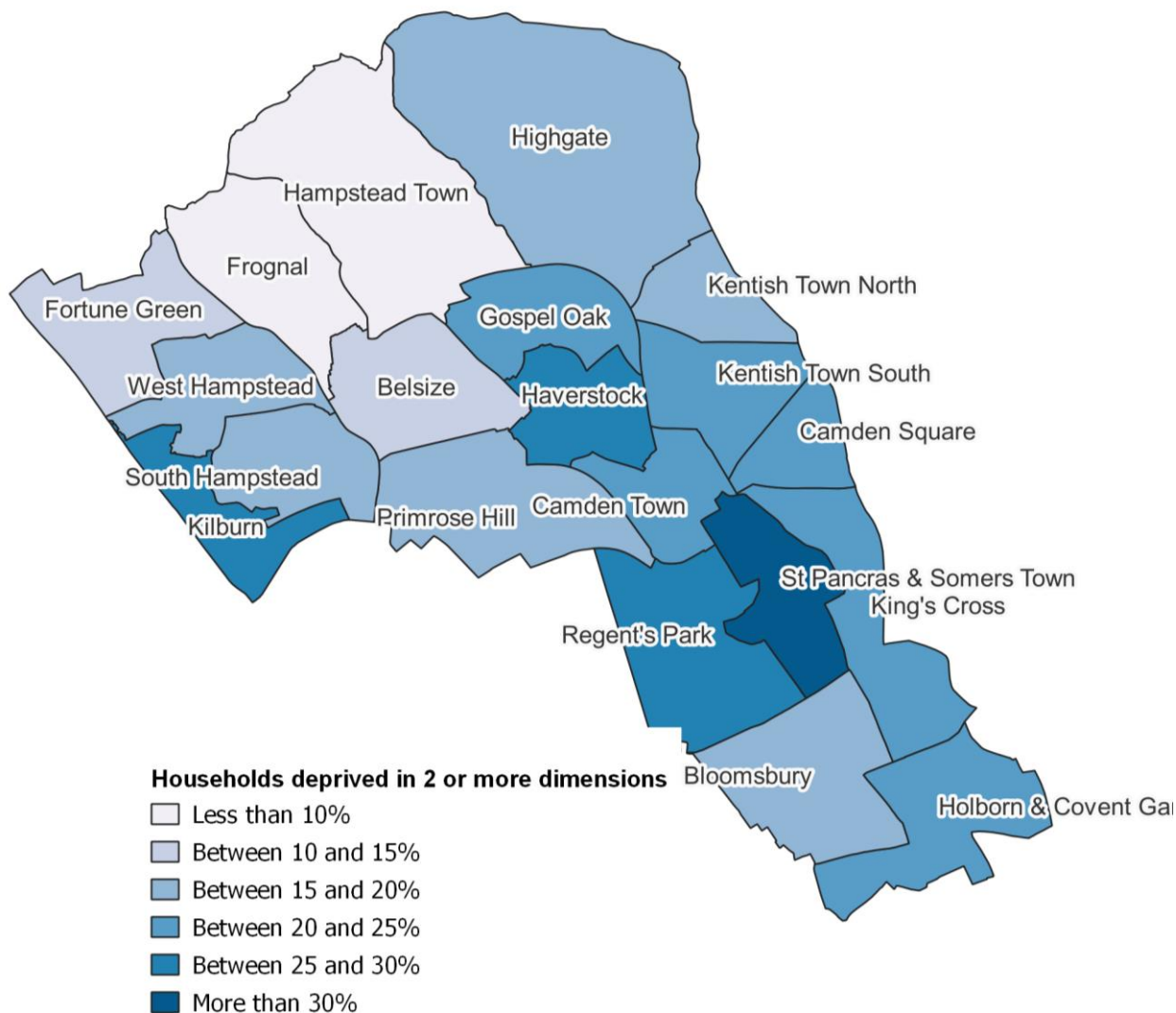

# Levels of Deprivation by Ward



This dataset shows the share of households that are estimated to have 2 or more dimensions of deprivation out of 4: Employment, education, health and disability, and household overcrowding, based on Census 2021 data.

**Education:** if no one has at least level 2 education and no one aged 16 to 18 years is a full-time student.

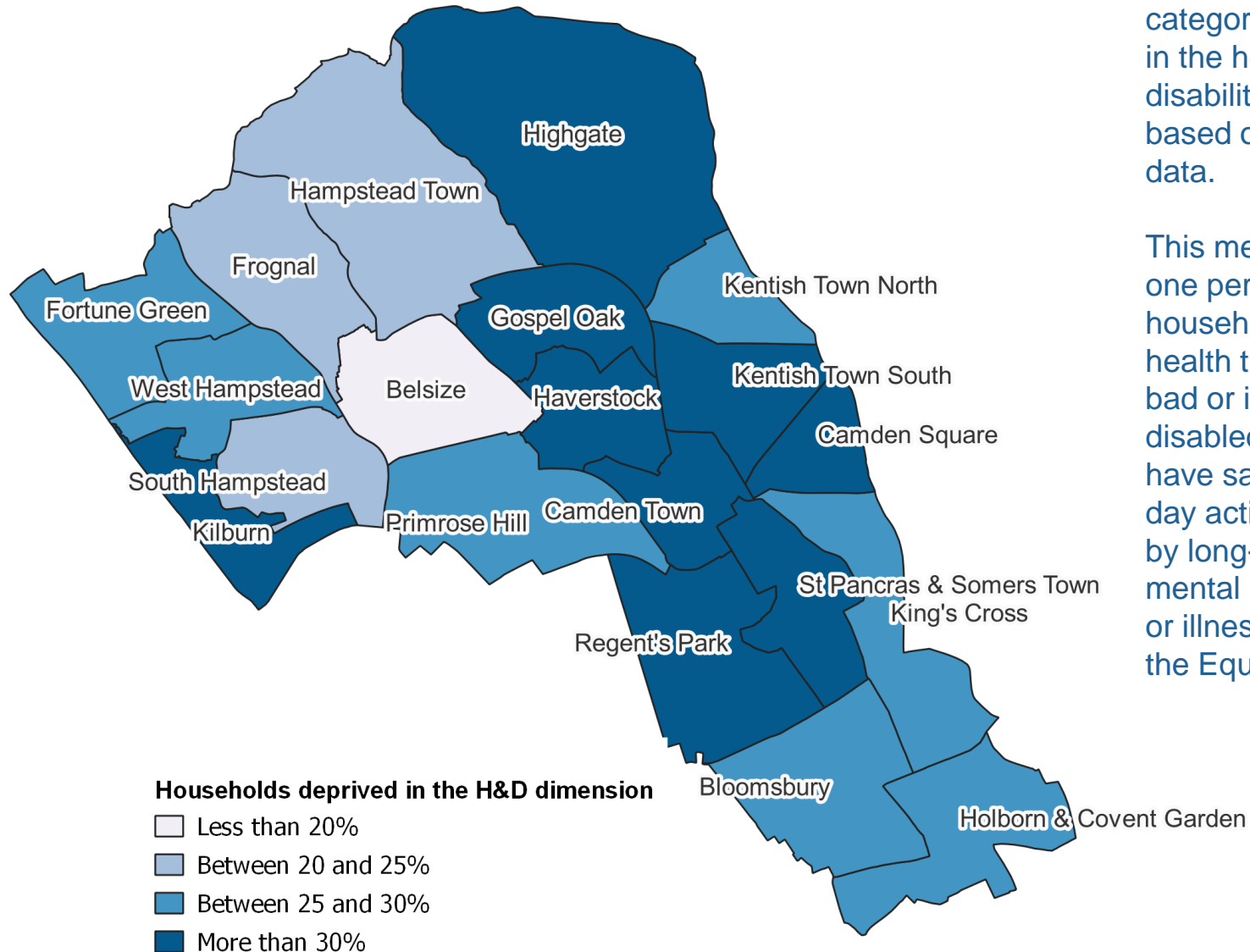
**Employment:** if any member of the household, not a full-time student, is either unemployed or economically inactive due to long-term sickness or disability.

**Health:** if any person in the household has general health that is bad or very bad or is identified as disabled (people who have said their day-to-day activities are limited by long-term physical or mental health conditions or illnesses, in line with the Equality Act (2010)).

**Housing:** if the household's accommodation is either overcrowded, in a shared dwelling, or has no central heating.

This dataset shows the share of households categorised as deprived in the health and disability dimension, based on Census 2021 data.

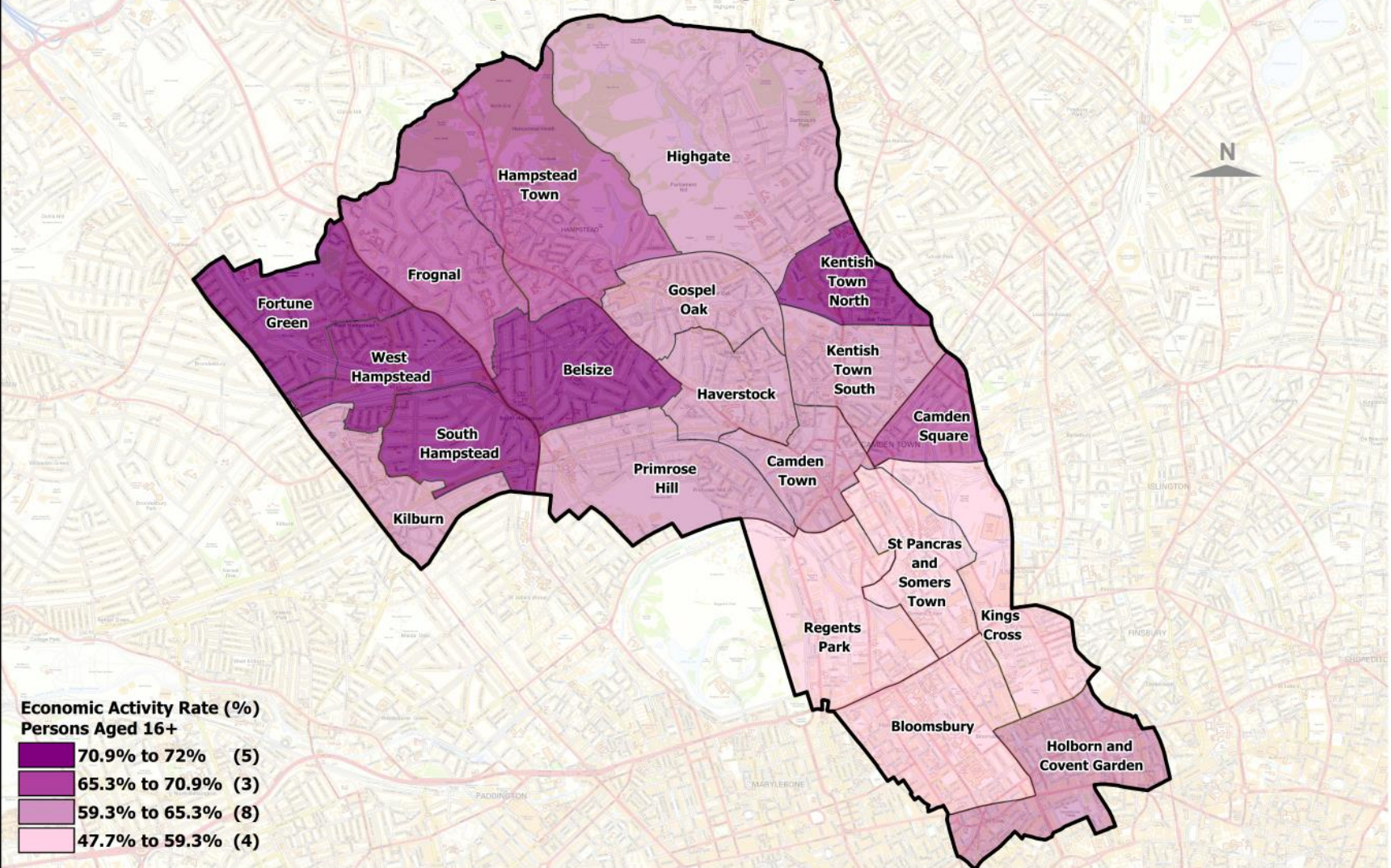

That means that between 15 to 21 March 2021, they were either in employment, unemployed but looking for work, or waiting to start a job that had been offered and accepted.

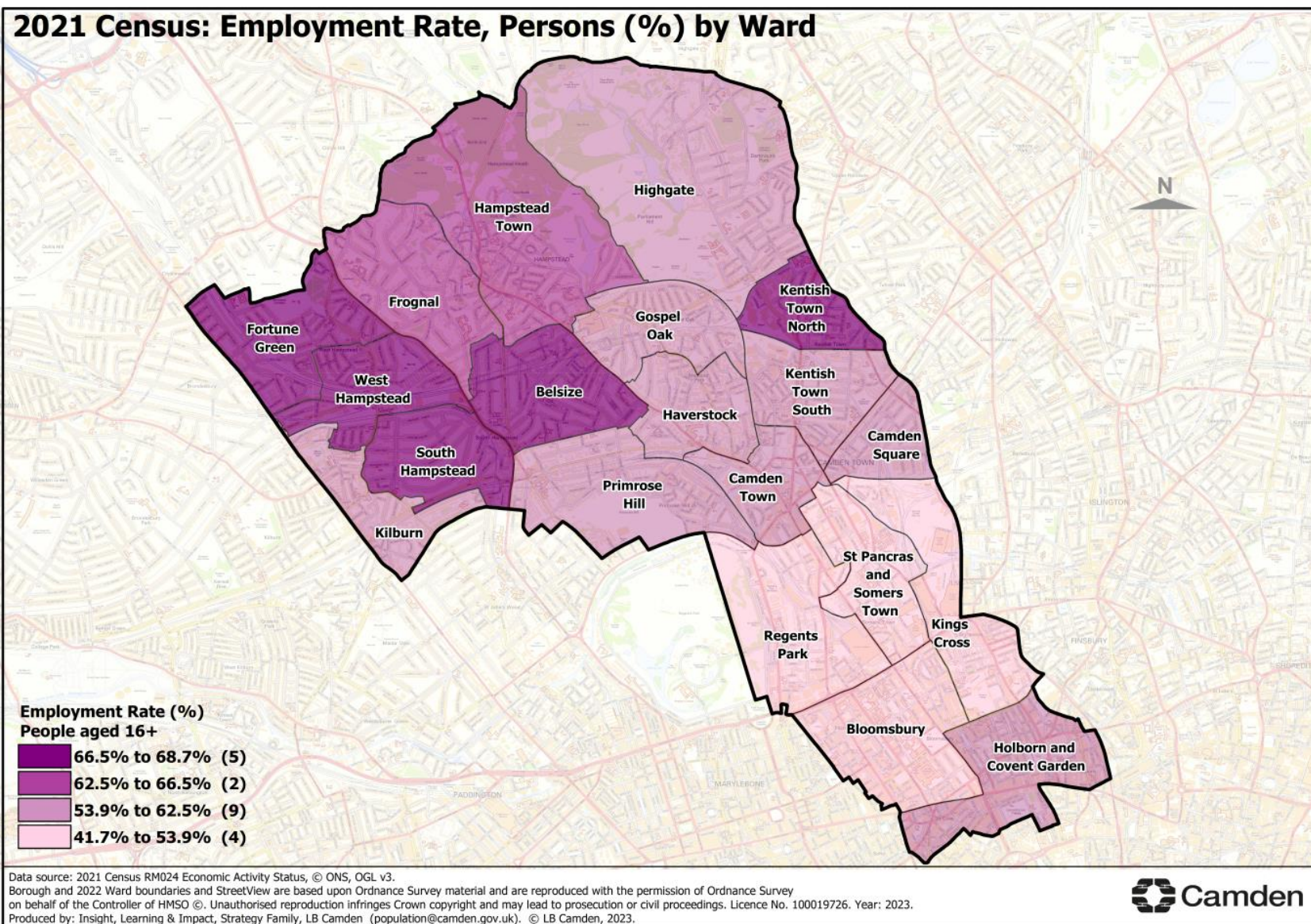

# Employment rate, by Ward based on Census 2021 data



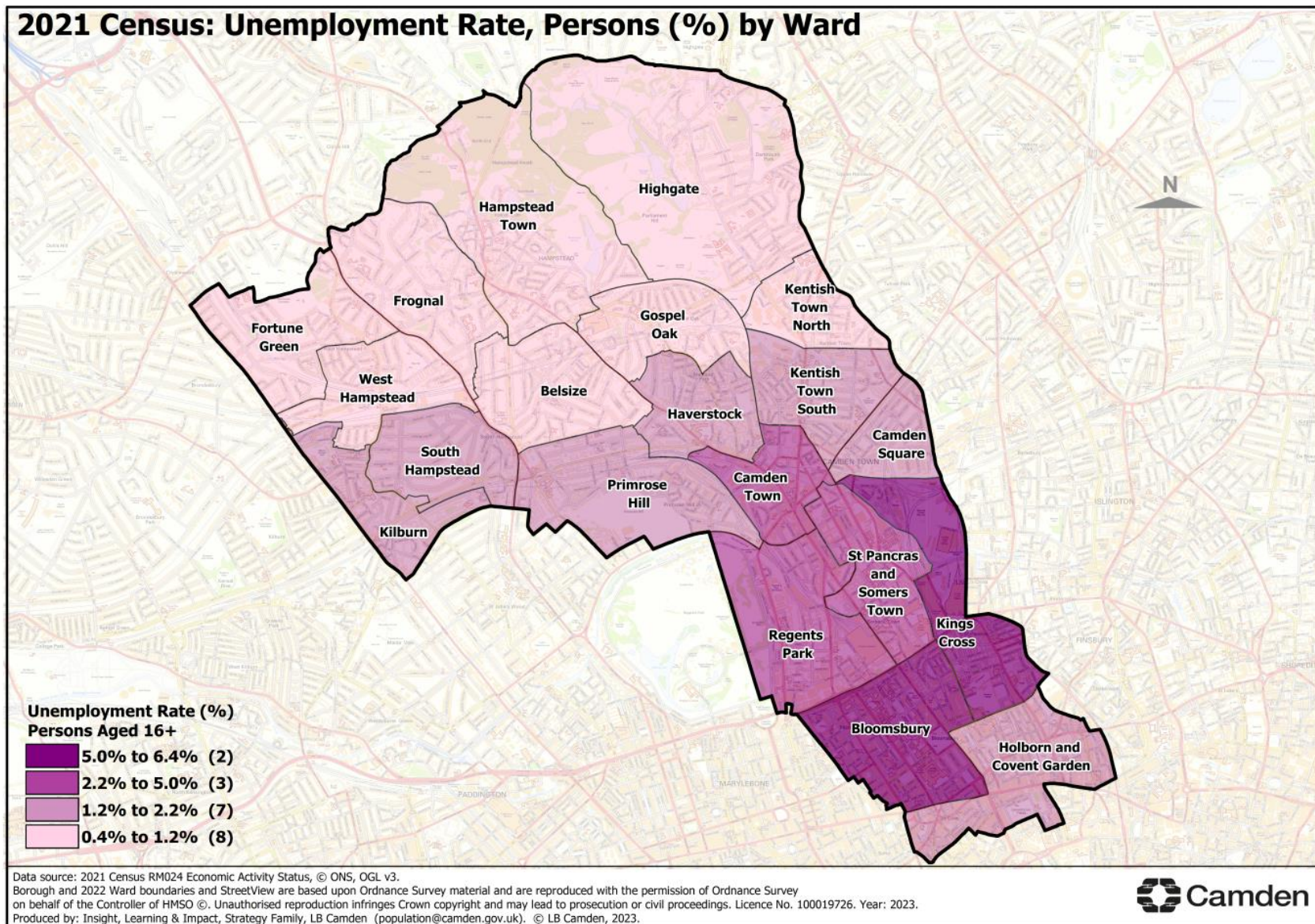
This data shows the employment rate by ward, according to Census data. This means the share of people aged 16 and over who were either employed or self-employed on Census day.

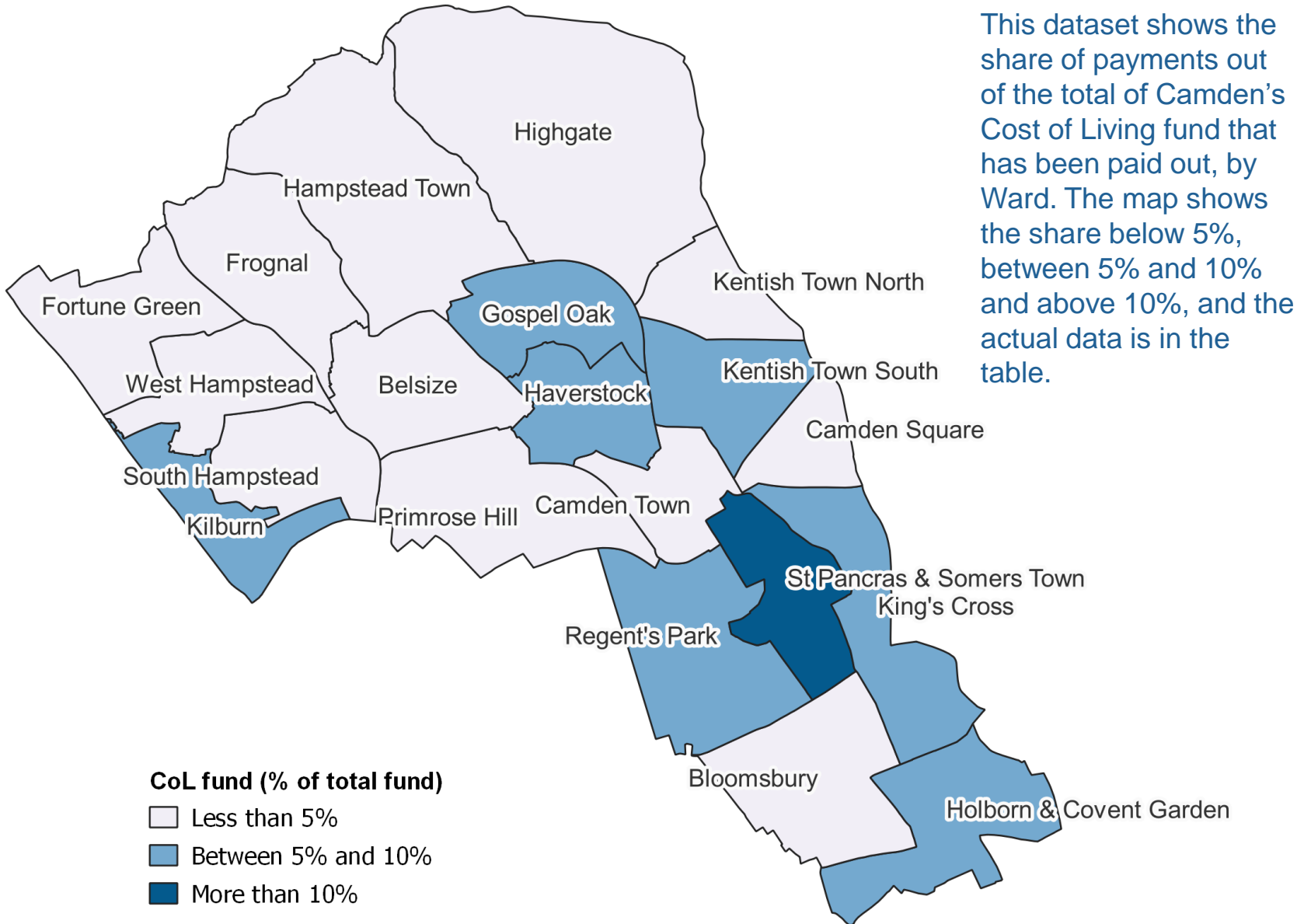

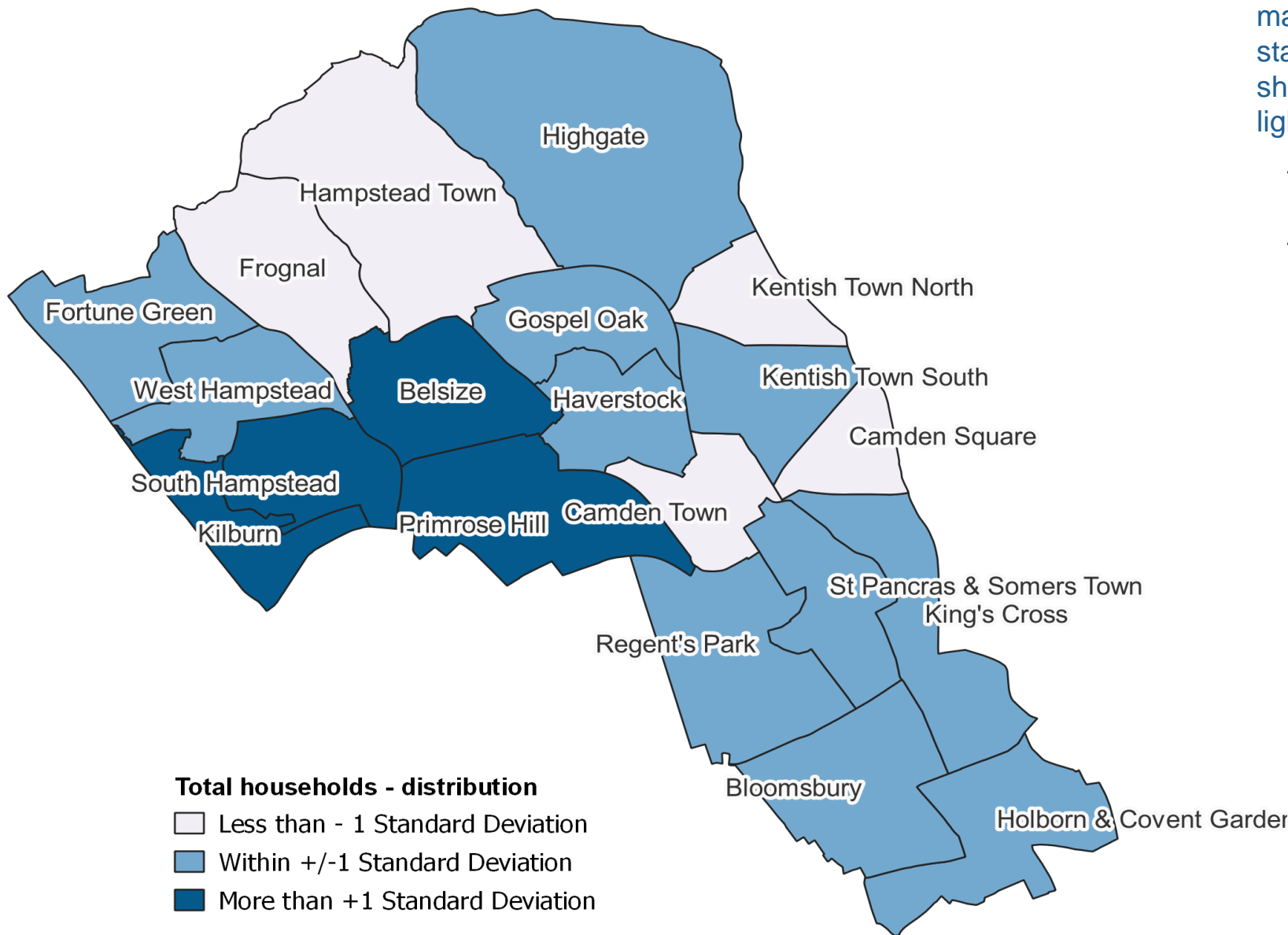

# Total number of Households, by Ward

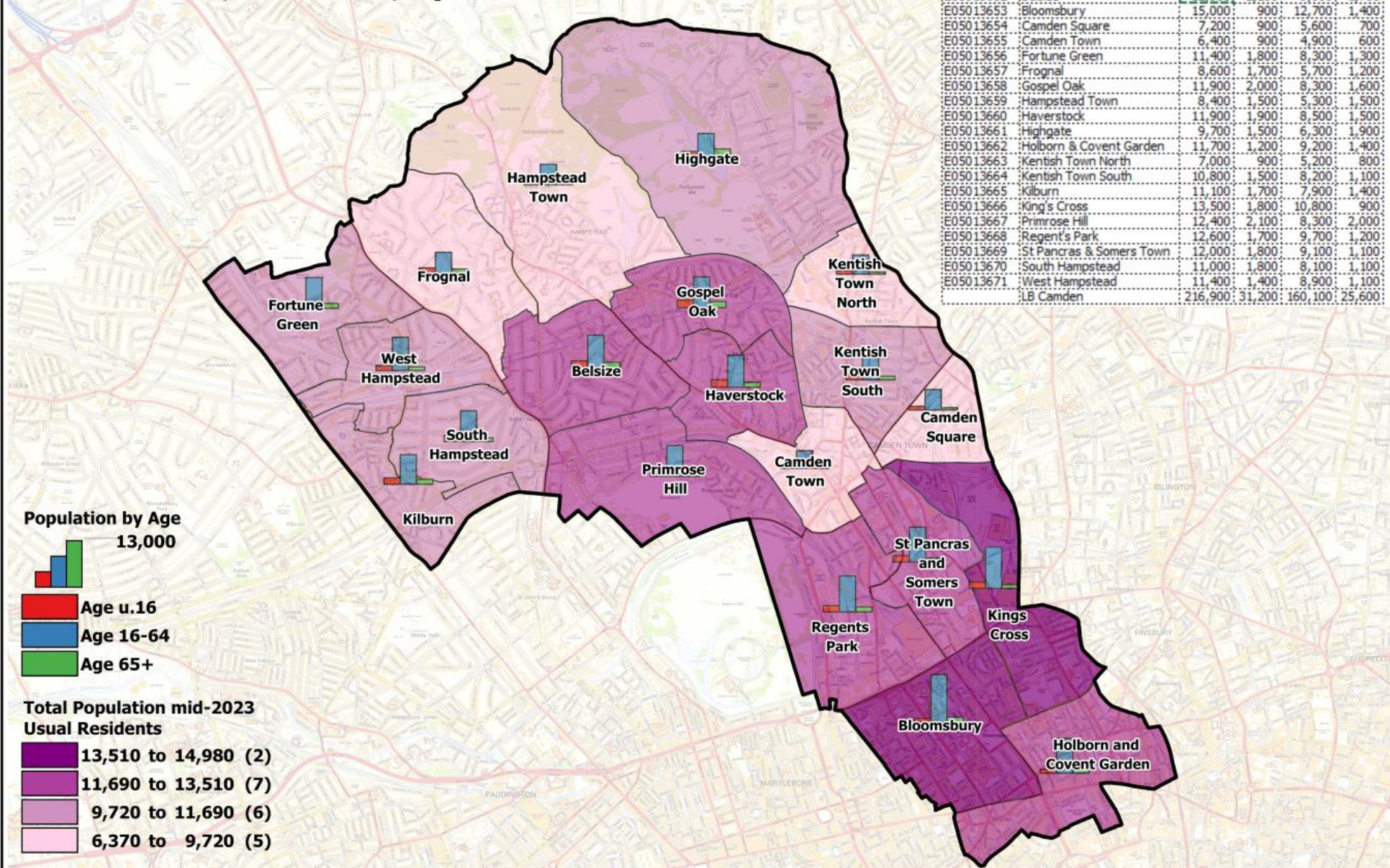

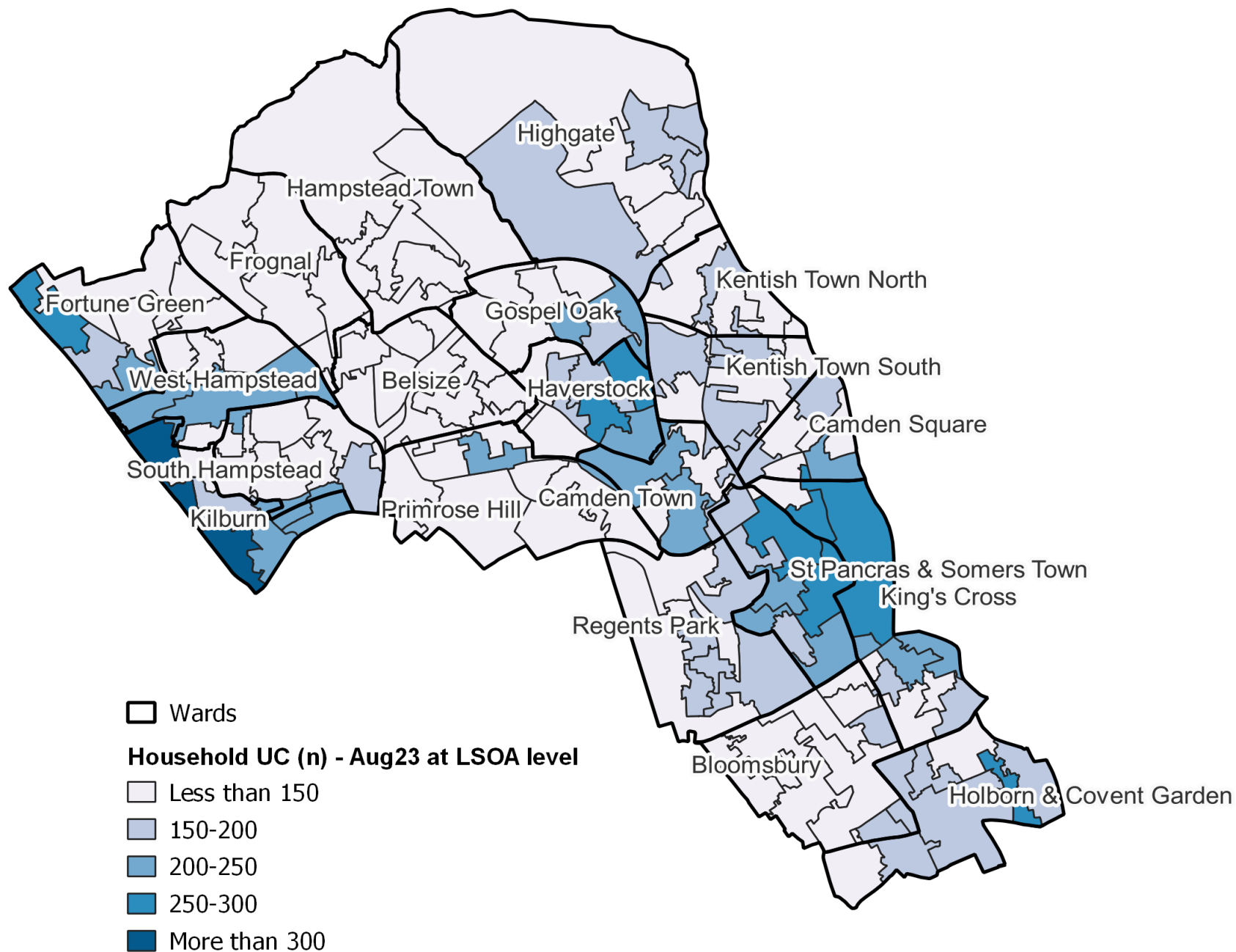

## Households receiving Universal Credit, by LSOA, August 2023

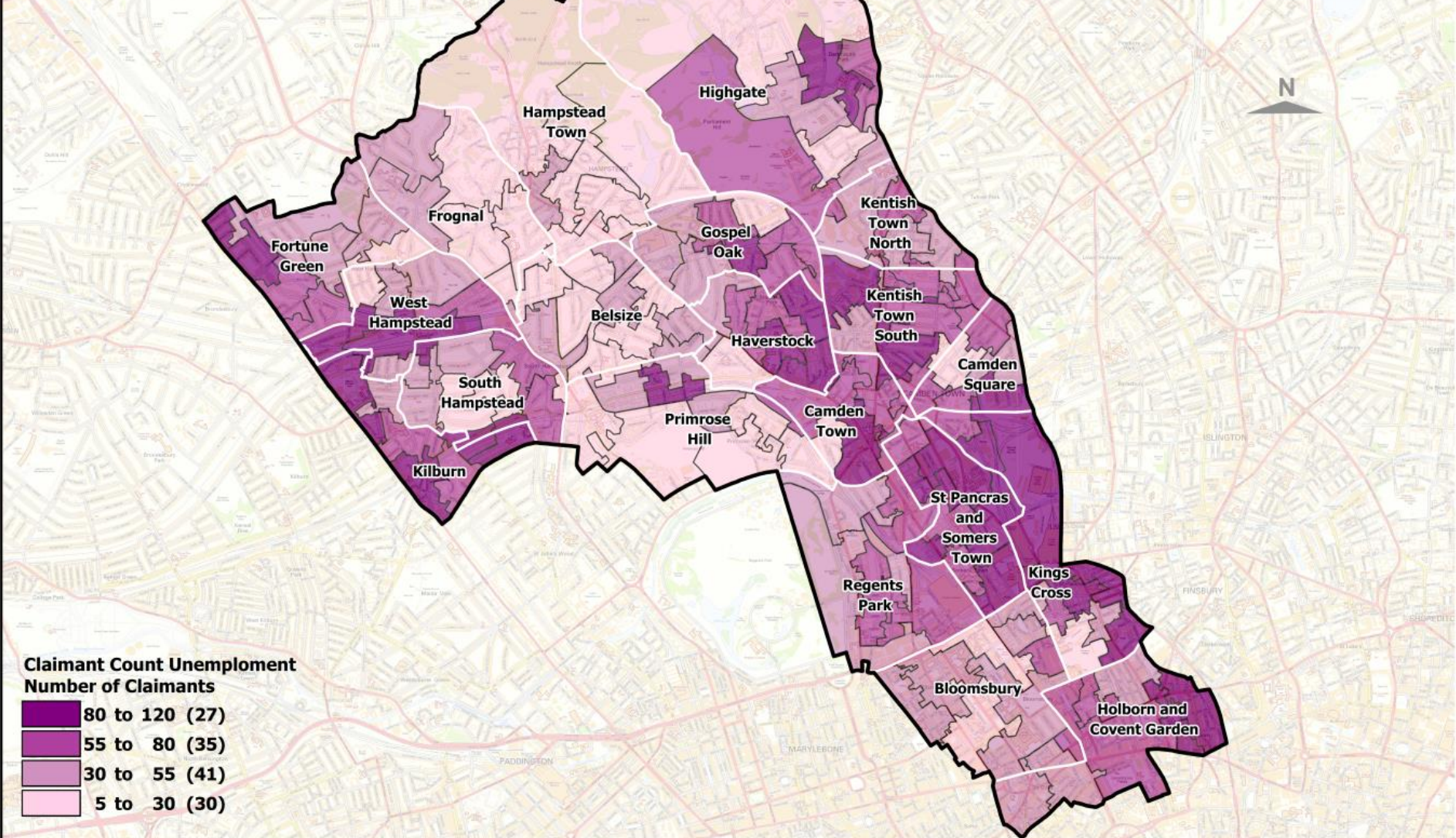
Number of households receiving Universal Credit by LSOA, according to the DWP data for August 2023.

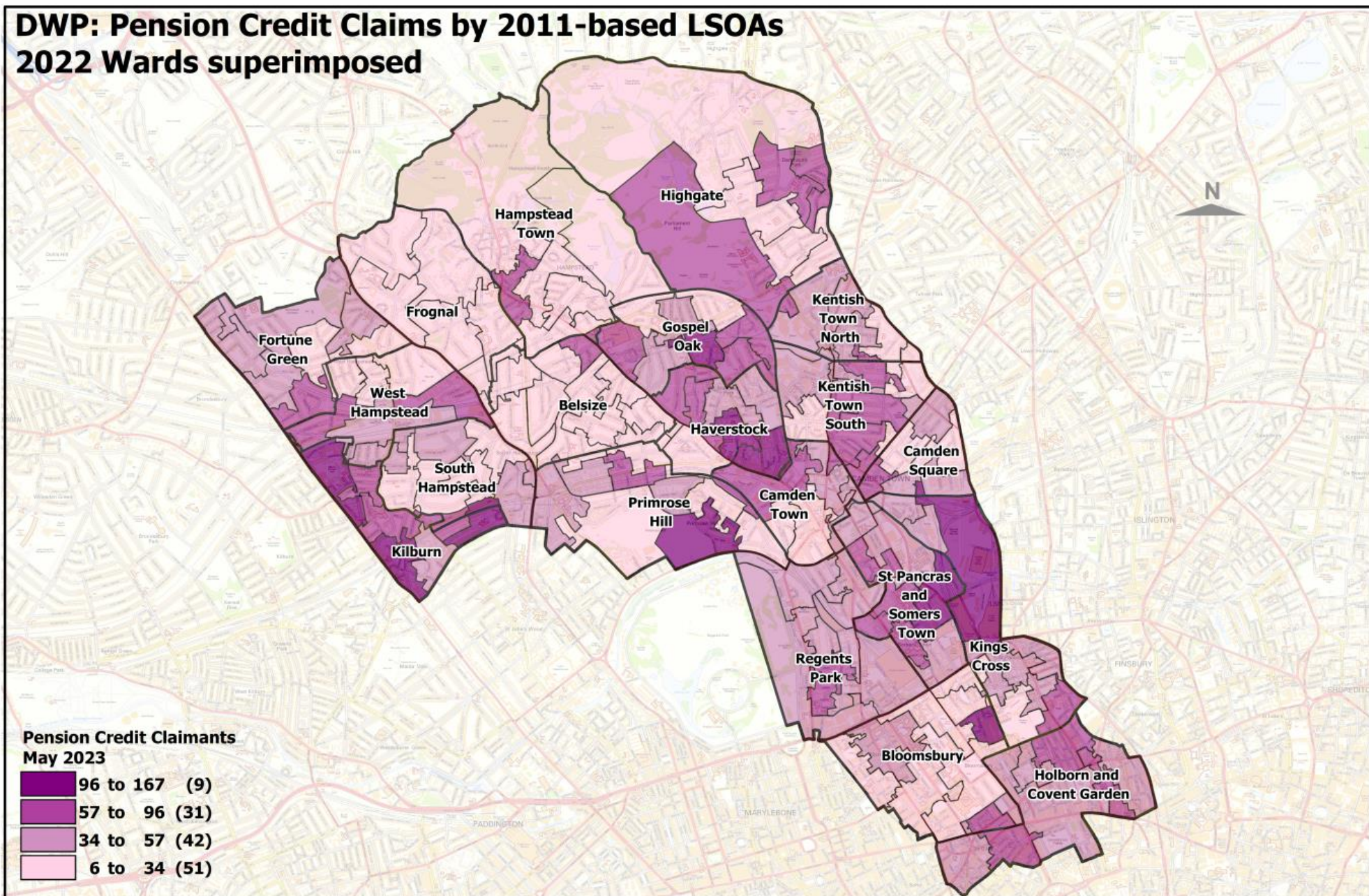

# DWP: Pension Credit Claims by 2011-based LSOAs 2022 Wards superimposed



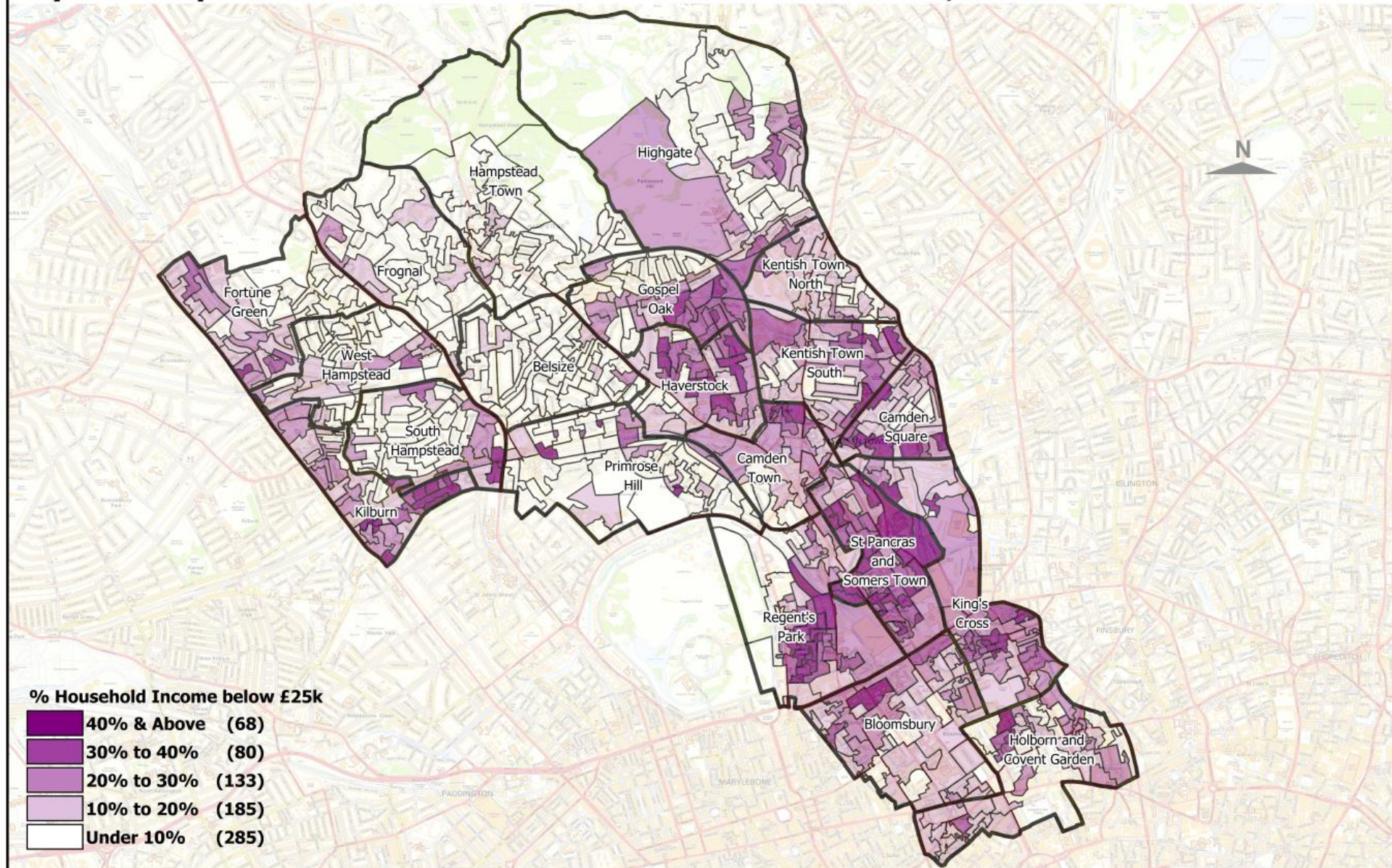
